Global Citizenship

Children are developing a growing awareness of their rights and responsibilities within the school setting and beyond in their communities. As part of the School Improvement Plan 2024-2025, the school aims to refresh the 'Vision, Values and Aims' and 'Curriculum Rationale' to ensure currency and relevance to learners, families and the whole school community. Staffing Update

The school welcomes Miss Paula Goudie to the school. Miss Goudie will share the class teacher role of Room 3 on a Monday and Tuesday and alternate Wednesdays.

School Support

Pupil learning support is the responsibility of the class teacher. At times, your child may be offered additional support for learning to help them to overtake specific targets for allocated periods of time, staff permitting. This additional support may be provided by Mr J McSorley (P4-7), Mrs Wilson (P1-3), support assistants, Mrs J Cowan (Specialist Support Teacher) and Mr C Waddell (Educational Psychologist) depending of your child's needs and the overall school priorities for assessment and intervention. Please note, although your child may be allocated periods of support, interventions are required to be offered fairly across the school on a needs based basis. Intervention allocations will be reviewed at approximately six weeks intervals. Changes to school priorities can sometimes occur due to the changing needs of learners and circumstances of families throughout the school year. Parents / carers of children with Additional Support Plans will have an opportunity to review these plans at Parents' Evenings. If you wish to raise any issues regarding your child's learning or well-being, please do not hesitate to contact the school office who will forward your communication to the most relevant member of the staff team.

Faith Life Update - The Holy Sacraments

General Reminders

School Improvement Plan / Standards and Qualities Report

School Uniform

Many thanks to parents/carers for supporting the children to present to school in full uniform. Reminder children should wear white shirt, tie and grey trousers / skirts or pinafores. Polo shirts can be worn on PE days only. Children should wear black or red school shoes. Any trainers worn should be fully black in colour (black self-coloured trainers). Children wearing blazers are reminded to bring a waterproof jacket for inclement weather. Children will be encouraged to engage in outdoor learning. Staff may select any day of the week to offer outdoor learning opportunities. As a result, it is advised that children bring a waterproof jacket to school.

Parental Collection Notice

Reminder to all families that individuals dropping off and collecting P1-4 from school should be aged 16 or over. The school will not permit children from P1-4 to leave school with an individual under the age of 16. This is a safeguarding measure to ensure children are collected by a responsible adult. Parents/carers of Primaries 5-7 are requested to complete a permissions form to indicate their intentions for their child. The children will not be released to walk home unless the permission form is completed to safeguard the children.

P1 Change of Clothes

Please could we ask that children of P1 have a change of clothes available in school. Clothes will be kept on their peg and used in the event of a lunch spill, toileting accident etc.

Notifications of a Change to Medicines

Reminder that all medicines (including over the counter medicines and cough sweets) must be recorded on an Administration of Medicines Form. These must be submitted directly to the school office.

Notifications of a Change of Address / Emergency Contacts

Reminder to all parents/carers that the school should be notified of any changes of address or emergency contact details. All data should be accurate and up to date to enable the school to respond swiftly and appropriately to any emergency circumstance.

Mobile Phones

Children are asked not to bring mobile phones or digital devices to school. Mobile phones which are brought to school on parental request should be submitted to the school office at 9am and collected at 2.55pm. Mobile phones will not be permitted to be used in the school environment. Children bringing mobile phones or digital devices to school do so at their own risk. The school will not take any responsibility for loss or damage.

Monitoring Attendance

The school will continue to promote positive school attendance. The School Leadership Team monitors attendance and seeks to support families when attendance drops below appropriate levels. It is beneficial to the children to maximise attendance to enable them to engage in learning and wider experiences. Improved attendance is a priority. The school will aim to continue to set the percentage threshold for attendance at 90%, in 2024-2025, in line with South Lanarkshire Council data. Any child with: attendance below 90%, patterns of in-attendance which are not substantiated by Health Professionals or exceptional circumstances, late arrivals and late pick-ups at periodic review will automatically be assigned to the school Attendance Monitoring and Tracking Pathway which involves liaison with parents/carers and, where necessary, referral to linked Education or other agencies. In addition, the school continues to set high standards for improvement in the school's overall average for school attendance which will be reviewed regularly.

The school office staff will aim to direct your call/ email to the relevant member of staff. I look forward to continuing to work with all children, staff and families, in partnership and in a climate of mutual trust, inclusion, equality and support. As per South Lanarkshire Council, I remind parents/carers that all communications should be conducted cordially and with courtesy. Violence and aggression, either physical, verbal or in writing, towards staff is not acceptable.

Calling the School

If calling to provide information to the school or to collect your child earlier than 3pm, please contact the school before 2.40pm. School office staff are **not** available to answer the school phones between 2.40 and 3.00pm. If planning an earlier collection time, please ensure your child is collected before 2.40pm as office staff are **not** available to support collections between 2.40pm and 3.00pm. During these times, support staff support the preparation for safe exit of the children. The Senior Leadership Team monitor requests for early collection. Patterns of early collection which are not relevant to scheduled appointments will be recorded and discussed with parents/carers.



Vision Values and Aims Refresh Consultation September 2024

School Moto—Aspiring Hearts and Minds

It is time to refresh the School Vision, Values and Aims!

It is important that children, staff, families, Fr King, linked agencies and stakeholders have an opportunity to participate in the consultation aimed at reviewing the 'Vision, Values and Aims' of St. Peter's Primary School.

Step 1 - The school Staff Team, Support Staff Team and Fr King worked collaboratively to select a range of potential values under five key themes which take account of current school, local and national priorities and the culture and community of the school..

Step 2 - The Pupil Leadership Team participated in a collaborative activity aimed at refining this list of potential values to three values within five key themes which reflect their pupil led vision for our school.

Step 3 - All children present on the day of the questionnaire 3rd September 2024 will be offered the opportunity to participate in a child friendly version of this questionnaire in class.

Step 4 - We invite parents/carers to complete one Google Form per family to help us select our refreshed school values which will form our new visionary drive for 'Excellence' and 'Belonging'. The questionnaire will be available for completion from 3rd September 2024 at 3.00pm to 5th September 2024 at 3.00pm. The link to the form will be sent by email.

Step 5 - The children will be informed of the selected values on Friday 6th September 2024. Families will be informed in Newsflash update week beginning 9th September 2024. The values will be used to develop new aims and a linked a vision. The school will then use this information to update the Curriculum Rationale and refresh the school celebration of success awards.

Health and Safety Update

PE Health and Safety Notice

For health and safety, children with longer than shoulder length hair should have their hair tied up for PE, unless for any medically specified reason (informed to the school by parent/carer). It is advised that earrings are not worn on PE days. If it is not possible to remove stud earrings, they should be taped up for PE. All drop or loop earrings must be removed for participation in PE and physical activities. All other jewellery should be removed for PE lessons. All children should wear appropriate indoor shoes (plimsolls) when participating in PE indoors. Children will not be permitted to wear Crocs, boots, high heeled typed shoes, slippers or shoes with no covered heels as indoor shoes or for PE due to the safety risk to children. Indoor shoes should be shoes that are not worn outside to reduce wear damage to floors and carpets. In addition, we encourage children not to wear false nails to school. Children will not be permitted to participate in PE, Muga or Trim Trail activities whilst wearing false nails (this includes any type of nail augmentations e.g extensions which are not the child's natural nail) due to the risk of harm or injury.

Traffic Management Health and Safety Notice

Families are reminded that children are asked to exit the school via the pathways provided. As part of our Traffic Management Systems, children should not cross the car park. It is hugely important that adults collecting children also observe this rule to ensure the children are supported to follow the safety rules. Vehicles blocking or parking at emergency or main gate exits or out with parking bays or the drop off zone will be asked to move their vehicles to a safe location. A consultation meeting has taken place regarding congestion on Hightstonehall Road outside the perimeter fences of St. Peter's Primary School, Neilsland Primary School and Woodlands Nursery with a view to considering measures to reduce parking in the area, eradicate parking on pavements, prevent engine idling and minimise additional safety risks to pedestrians and other road users. A further update will be provided in due course. In the interim, we would join with Neilsland Primary School and Woodlands Nursery to encourage children and families to walk to school, ride bicycles or scooters to keep active, reduce congestion and minimise impact to the environment. In addition, children bringing bikes / scooters to school should dismount and walk with the equipment in the school grounds to avoid accident or injury to themselves or others.

Inclement Weather Health and Safety Notice

A reminder to families that in the event of inclement weather (ice, snow, high winds) requiring the closure of some school gates the children will enter the building through the main pedestrian access gates and follow gritted pathways to the PE hall where they will be supervised by staff. Risk assessments of the outdoor pathways and playground areas are completed at regular intervals throughout the school day. Updates on the weather forecast or any advance weather warnings are considered.
